Mina Dennert is a Swedish journalist, social media expert and founder of the I Am Here International network which works to counter disinformation to defend human rights and freedom of speech. Much of her work involves supporting journalists, politicians and discriminated communities against online hate and misinformation campaigns that limit their freedom of speech and push them to self-censor. Her movement currently comprises more than 150,000 people worldwide.

In this keynote speech, Mina will talk about what we can do when we are faced with misinformation campaigns and hate speech online. She will explore the importance of value-based communication, how we can activate allies and build strong communities.

After Mina's speech, you will have the chance to ask questions and consider what this means for your own street paper.

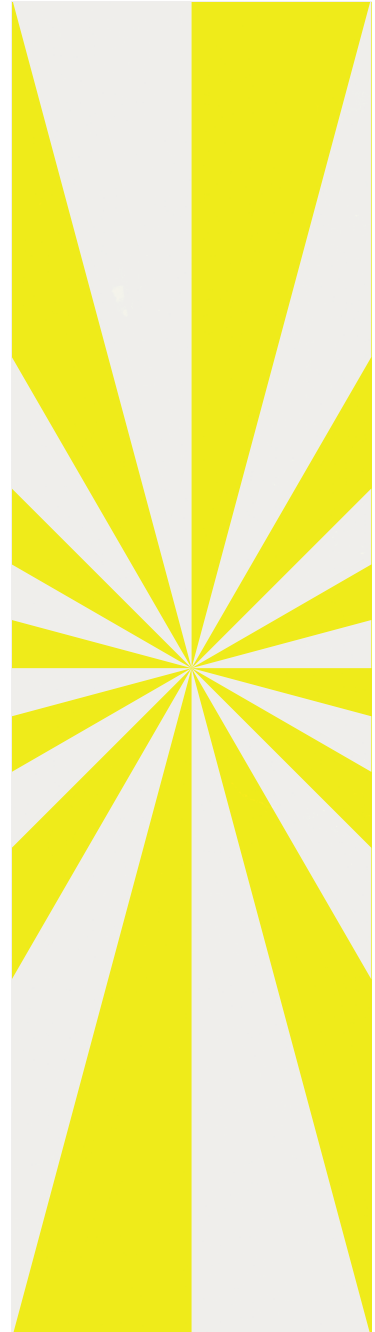

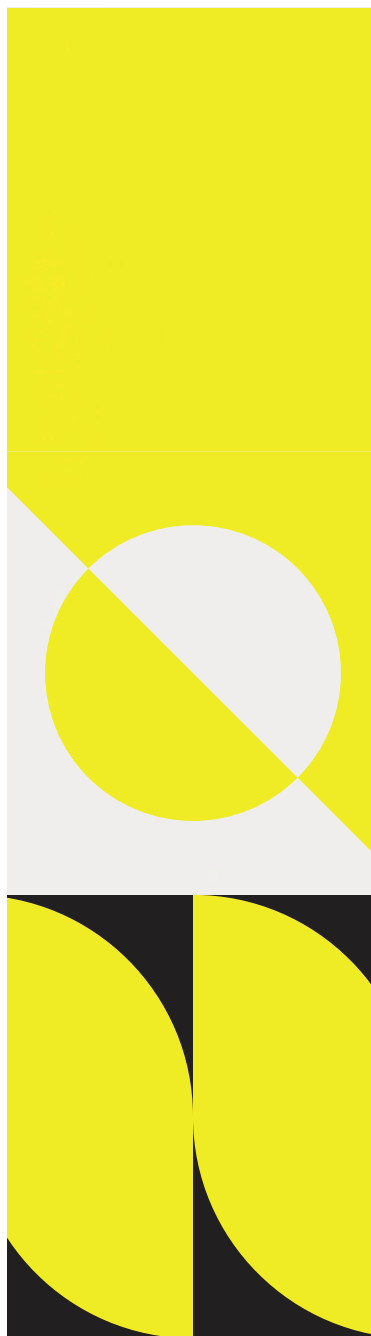

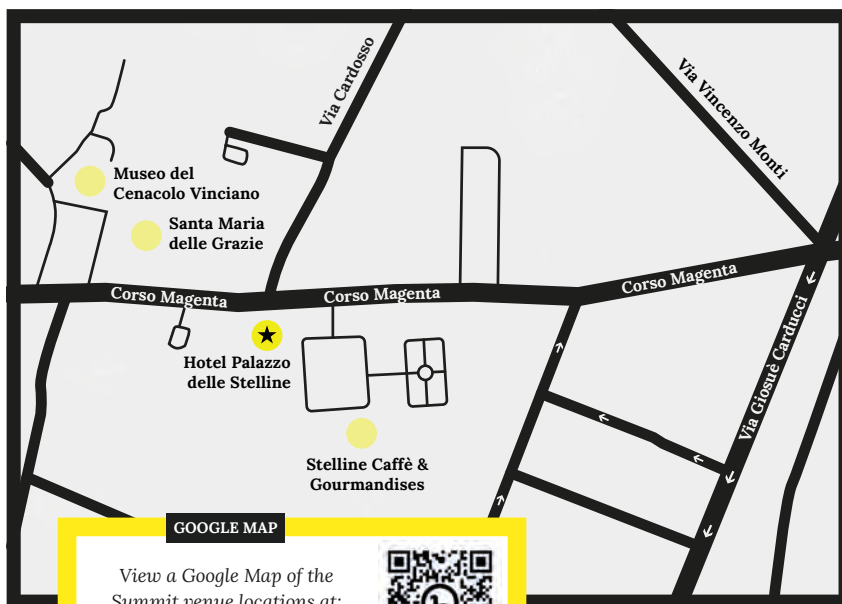
